Early Years

Nursery

Reception

The Reception children have had a busy week! The staff have been encouraging the children to think about different types of positive behaviour they show in school. The children spoke about the special ingredients to make a magical good behaviour potion. The children have had the opportunity to choose their own theme of books to put in the book corner. The children are now choosing to read more frequently there and really enjoying spending time together sharing a variety of texts.

Key Stage 1

Year 1

This week we welcomed Mrs Aldridge to the Year 1 team. The children were keen to show her the things they have learnt since September and explained how to use our environment. Our challenges this week have included learning to count in twos and exploring the seasons. You can help the children by counting in twos on the way from school, e.g. two cars, four cars, six cars etc. You could also discuss how the trees and flowers are changing as we are now in spring.

Year 2

This week Year 2 have been exploring number bonds and basic number facts. This helps the children with their recall of numbers and multiplications. In PE with have been enjoying yoga and mindfulness as well as some fitness. We are now moving away from the topic of dinosaurs and focusing on the new and exciting topic of Brazil which the children are loving.

Key Stage 2

Year 3

This week Year 3 have been exploring the features of a diary entry in English. P.E has been focused on throwing and catching. In art, children have been following instructions to create their own realistic self-portraits. The Roman military has been the subject of children's research in history. Computing has had children further developing their coding skills. In geography, children have been learning about the location of the UK as well as its countries and capital cities.

Year 4

This week Year 4 have been exploring the theme of heroes and monsters to continue our writing based on the legend of Beowulf. The children have loved creating their own monsters and imagining where they would live. In maths we have been ordering and sequencing numbers.

REMINDER: Well done for bringing water bottles in! Reading should be a priority at home and parents should be writing in reading records a few times a week.

Year 5

Year 5 have been looking at play scripts this week in English, turning our Brilliant Book, 'The Island', into a play. In maths we are finishing our lessons on graphs and moving onto fractions and, in art, we were working on self-portraits, using photographs of ourselves to work from.

REMINDER: Keep reading at home and making the most of Times Tables Rockstars – remember, every bit of practice you do sends your class up the leader board as well as improving your speed of recall.

Year 6

This week Year 6 have continued to learn about globalisation and have considered the impact of many children, all around the world, not having access to the internet. In English the children have started to plan a play script based on the story The Long Walk and have used ratio to compare quantities in maths.

REMINDER: Keep using TT Rockstars and remember to read daily and record in your Reading Record. PE kit must be in school on Wednesday and Friday.

Music

This week Year 1 have played percussion instruments with the song Rhythm in The Way We Walk, Year 3 are playing pieces using the C chord on the ukulele and Year 5 are continuing the module on the Dr Who theme tune and the work of the BBC Radiophonic workshop.
