Coaching opportunities and CPD for teachers	£870	<p>To support staff with the teaching and provision of dance within the PE curriculum leaving a future legacy of high quality dance teaching.</p> <p>Real PE course-focused on getting less active and less able pupils involved in and enjoying PE lessons.</p>	<p>Teaching staff that are better equipped and have increased confidence in teaching dance in PE.</p> <p>Fun and enjoyable dance lessons which every child can fully participate in regardless of ability.</p>
Affiliation fees	£2270 (SPSSA and YST)	To provide all children with access to a variety of sporting competitions and festivals.	<p>Over 20 competitions participated in throughout the year.</p> <p>Several ‘new’ sports were tried this year. For example, the school sent children to Boccia and New Age Kurling competitions.</p>

Year groups were provided with complete spare kits so that children were never without kit and did not miss PE curriculum time.</p>
Funding for extra-curricular clubs	£3168	<p>To introduce karate to the school and to help start a new Karate Club.</p> <p>Gymnastics Club before school to engage pupils and improve skills.</p> <p>To provide extra-curricular specialist coaches to enable high-quality provision.</p> <p>Provide opportunities for membership of sporting teams – Football Tag-Rugby Dodgeball Athletics.</p>	<p>Some previously non-active pupils engaged in extra-curricular sports activities. For example, the morning Karate Club reached full capacity each term and allowed pupils who were not previously involved in sport to take part.</p> <p>Active links with local community sports and leisure providers.</p> <p>New extra-curricular clubs.</p> <p>The morning gymnastics club was, like Karate Club, full through the year. Specialist coaching has provided opportunity for gifted pupils to further develop their skills.</p>

Without transport to and from these competitions our pupils would not be able to participate. This continued commitment to additional sport resulted in the school achieving the Gold Sports Mark.</p> <p>There is a growing sporting ethos in the school.</p> <p>Every child in Years 3-6 received swimming lessons for a block of 6-7 weeks.</p> <p>Additional swimming for those assessed at being in danger of not achieving a suitable standard</p>
Whole School PE Curriculum Day (Kidzfit)	£380	To promote health and fitness with the whole school population and to further engage children in regular activity.	The day was highly successful with excellent levels of active pupil participation. Children in each year group could explain what they had learnt and gained from the sessions and could describe how they might use what they learnt. For example, many intended on playing the games outside of school.
